



Guidance for Writing Chronologies

Chronologies are a fundamental way of us building a picture of a child/ren, family and extended family and how their history impacts on the family's current functioning. They are an essential tool in our assessments. **Chronologies should be updated on a monthly basis** (even if there are no perceived/ significant events). Managers should review chronologies in supervision. All cases in PLO or proceedings **must have a full chronology** which starts from the birth of the parents.

Chronologies should be completed using all of the records held by children's services on the case. This may require the retrieval of historical documents from the archive.

Chronologies should not be a summary of the case file; but should be a list of significant events in chronological date order in a child's life.

Checklist of significant events: (can you tick all of the following?)

Date of birth of the birth parents, child +siblings

Date of deaths of siblings/ significant relatives

Date child's parents established their relationship

Date of referrals to children's services & action taken, and outcome i.e. s47

Date of child protection case conferences and outcomes

Date of CLA episodes

Dates of CLA reviews and over arching outcome of review

Placement moves by the child

Date of referrals by children's services to other agencies and outcomes

Date of any significant health events or injuries/safeguarding concerns

Dates of Statutory visits — only if non compliance is an issue

Dates of legal planning meetings

Dates of making orders

Dates of police involvement and action taken

Date of case closure

Dates of completion of assessments and outcomes.
